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PROJECT ARYA: ATTRACTING AND RETAINING YOUTH IN AGRICULTURE

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Introduction

Project ARYA (Attracting and Retaining Youth in Agriculture) is an initiative launched by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) in 2015-16 to empower rural youth and involve them in entrepreneurial activities in the agriculture and allied sectors. This project aims to generate employment opportunities, provide sustainable income and promote agricultural development in rural areas. Implemented through Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) in 25 states, the project identifies 200-300 rural youths per district and provides them with training in areas such as seed processing, apiary, mushroom cultivation, dairy farming and vermicomposting. facilitating network groups, enterprise setup and stakeholder linkages, Project ARYA addresses key challenges such as unemployment, rural migration and food security. It aspires to make agriculture a more attractive and viable career option, thereby fostering sustainable rural development and economic progress. The implementation project's structured continuous monitoring aim to ensure long-term impact on rural livelihoods and national food security.
