2) Educational workshop: Blending learning with farming

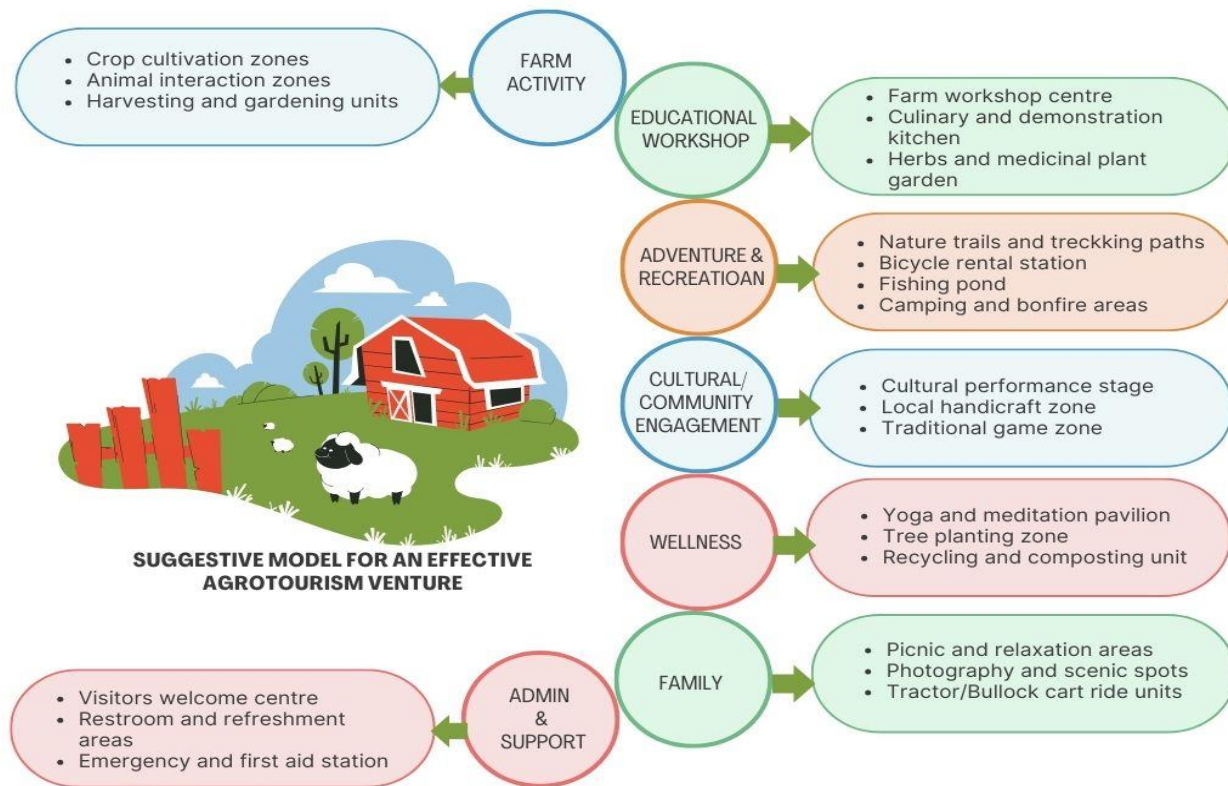
The educational workshop focuses on knowledge transfer, making the agrotourism venture a platform for learning.
